





FIRE RESTRICTIONS

ARE IN EFFECT FOR OKANOGAN-WENATCHEE NATIONAL FOREST

THE FOLLOWING ARE PROHIBITED ON NATIONAL FOREST







Building, maintaining, attending, or using a fire, campfire or stove fire, including charcoal and other open flames, EXCEPT within campfire rings established by the Forest Service at developed and designated campgrounds, in certain Wilderness areas, and at other sites specifically excepted by the Fire Restriction Order.



Violating any state law concerning burning or fires



Possessing,
discharging or
using any kind
of firework,
explosive or other
pyrotechnic device



Possessing or using a motor vehicle off National Forest roads and trails



Smoking, except within enclosed vehicle or building, designated campground, or while stopped in an area barren of flammable material

Pressurized or bottled liquid fuel stoves, lanterns, or heating devices are permitted if no flammable material is present within 3 feet of the device. The device must have a functioning onoff switch or valve that can extinguish the fire immediately.







Penalties for Violations

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. 16 USC § 551 and 18 USC §§ 3559, 3571, and 3581. These restrictions are in addition to those prohibitions enumerated in Subpart 'A' of 36 CFR § 261 and any other special restrictions pertaining to the described lands.
